



This 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 390 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2010 will be remembered, on the whole, as a very good vintage. This was especially so in Tasmania, where growing conditions were just about perfect.

The bouquet shows shades of spicy oak with subtle floral notes of honeysuckle blossom. The palate is quite tightly structured, with pear and nut characters and good weight, length and texture. The judicious use of well integrated oak has resulted in an elegant wine with a refreshing finish.

This wine is a great accompaniment for rich foods, such as pasta with a cream based sauce!
