



This 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 375 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2010 will be remembered, on the whole, as a very good vintage. This was especially so in Tasmania, where growing conditions were just about perfect.

This wine has delightful spicy lemon, honey and herbal aromas. The palate is well balanced, rich and seamless with great length and a full ripe mid palate showing an array of citrus characters and an alluring creamy texture.

With its refreshing zesty finish this wine is a perfect accompaniment to a wide range of fine foods, and is ideally suited to seafood and spicy Asian style cuisine.
