



This 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 375 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

On the mainland, vintage 2011 will go down as one of the worst vintages in living memory. However, once again Tasmania proved its resilience and cool climate advantage over the big island, as this release illustrates.

An easy drinking style of wine with alluring aromas of liqueur raspberry. The palate is soft and well balanced with delightful berry fruit characters and a clean crisp finish.

An ideal wine for informal entertaining and ideally suited to casual dining - it is best served slightly chilled. Produced in a drier style to accompany a range of fine foods.
