



This 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 390 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2012 will be remembered, on the whole, as an extraordinary vintage in Tasmania, equal perhaps to the famous vintage of 2005. Growing conditions were simply perfect and produced wines of outstanding intensity, depth and length.

Classic and full flavoured Sauvignon Blanc style with aromas of gooseberry and hints of tropical fruit. An elegant balanced wine with a well structured, full flavoured palate, pleasant texture and a refreshing finish.

This wine displays an array of fruit aromas and flavours making it great for entertaining.
