



This 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium cool climate Tasmanian wines that are renowned as both complex and elegant. Since 1990, Bream Creek wines have garnered 18 trophies and over 390 show medals and have an enviable reputation for consistency and reliability.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2012 will be remembered, on the whole, as an extraordinary vintage in Tasmania, equal perhaps to the famous vintage of 2005. Growing conditions were simply perfect and produced wines of outstanding intensity, depth and length.

This wine has an appealing nose with rose petal, some tropical fruit characters and a hint of spice. The palate is full and persistent, with yellow plum flavours, good length and structure, lovely silkiness and a refreshing, clean finish.

Whilst ideal with sushi, shellfish, Asian style cuisine or rich cheeses, this rare German variety has the ability to complement an unusually wide range of foods and is especially suited to spicy cuisine.

We consider it our best release of Schönburger to date.
