Bream Creek

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium wines from Tasmania's naturally cool climate and has been rewarded with 19 trophies and over 394 show medals since 1990. The 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted what was arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Tasting Note



Vintage 2010 will be remembered, on the whole, as a very good vintage. This was especially so in Tasmania, where growing conditions were just about perfect.

This dessert style wine has alluring aromas of rose petal with hints of tropical fruit. The palate is softly textured, full and elegant with subtle shades of Turkish Delight and tropical fruits. Well balanced, rich and flavoursome, but with a clean refreshing finish. This wine is very well matched with cheeses (especially blue) and decadent desserts.
