Bream Creek

Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium wines from Tasmania's naturally cool climate and has been rewarded with 19 trophies and over 394 show medals since 1990. The 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1973, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted what was arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2010 will be remembered, on the whole, as a very good vintage. This was especially so in Tasmania, where growing conditions were just about perfect.

This is an elegant yet powerful and intense wine with a complex earthy bouquet of white pepper and spicy dark berries. Spicy dark berry and dark cherry notes feature on the palate, which is also savoury, firm and well structured, with good length and features attractive powdery tannins. It would match perfectly with roast duck garnished with sour cherry sauce.
