



Bream Creek Vineyard produces premium wines from Tasmania's pristine cool climate and has been rewarded with over 20 trophies and more than 470 show medals since 1990. Our 7.5ha vineyard at Marion Bay in the south-east of Tasmania was originally planted in 1974, making it one of the oldest commercial vineyards on the island. Fred Peacock purchased the vineyard in 1990 and expanded the Pinot Noir and Chardonnay plantings, as well as introducing Sauvignon Blanc. Fred also planted what was arguably the first commercial planting of the rare German grape Schönburger in the southern hemisphere.

Tasting Note

Vintage 2013 was a dream vintage in many ways – great flowering, relatively dry weather with low disease pressure and a warmer than average summer, which provided the warmth and length in the season to fully mature the grapes.

A bold and powerful Pinot Noir, made in the Bream Creek style. There are intense notes of black cherries, dark plums and blackberries on the nose. The palate is smooth, deep and powerful, rich with dark plums, black cherries and spice. Finishing with balanced fine tannins, and featuring excellent balance and length, this wine can be enjoyed now or cellared for 7-10 years with confidence.
